GDP growth: 0 percent. The Lansing-East Lansing metropolitan area saw contraction in state government, manufacturing and retailing during the past decade. But the area gained two General Motors Co. assembly plants and investment in health care. There also was growth in the high-tech sector, some of which was attributed to commercialized research at Michigan State University.

Lansing's GDP share of the state economy grew from 4 percent to 5 percent during the decade.

"We're focusing on entrepreneurship and innovation, and building the infrastructure to support that," said De Winkle, senior vice president at the Lansing Economic Area Partnership.
