GDP growth: -11 percent. Monroe is another metro area in the I-75 corridor that suffered with manufacturing and construction sector declines. Manufacturing output fell 41 percent as production volumes fell at Monroe-based La-Z-Boy Inc. and auto-related manufacturers.

But Monroe saw growth among other new employers, including sports mega store Cabela's and the Global Engine Manufacturing Alliance, which produces four-cylinder engines for Chrysler and Fiat.
