Kalamazoo-Portage and Battle Creek in Southwest Michigan surprisingly outpaced Ann Arbor, Grand Rapids and all other metro areas in the state in economic **growth** over the past decade. Kalamazoo and Battle Creek were the only places in the state to boost output between 2001 and 2009, the latest year for which data was available.

More than 85 percent of all goods and services in Michigan were produced in 14 metro areas over the decade.
