Title IV-E Fellowship at MSU

Overview

The School of Social Work administers the Title IV-E Child Welfare Fellowship at Michigan State University. The goal of the Title IV-E Child Welfare Fellowship program is to provide financial support and educational resources to Master of Social Work students committed to post-graduate careers in public or private child welfare.

The primary elements:

- 1. Career development, support, and monthly meetings.
- 2. Child Welfare Certificate Endorsement requirement.
- 3. Financial support.
- 4. Employment obligation post-graduation with MSW.



Federal Social Security Title IV-E funds subsidize child welfare services to keep children in their families when possible, provide permanency planning services, and place children in out-of-home care. Child welfare services are those provided by state or county child protection, foster care, adoption and family services agencies. Title IV-E funds may also be used to support educational and training efforts for the current and future child welfare workforce, including:

- Direct financial assistance to graduate students.
- · Curriculum development.
- Practicum instruction.
