Bridge Michigan, the state's preeminent public policy online news site, seeks a data and accountability reporter to strengthen our award-winning journalism through data analysis and visualization. Beginning in July 2026, this two-year Report for America (RFA) fellowship offers an exceptional opportunity to impact how Michiganders understand critical issues.

This position will investigate government, education and demography in Michigan, using data to reveal trends, inequities and patterns to produce stories that translate complex datasets into meaningful journalism.

We seek a reporter with experience in database reporting, data visualization and computer-assisted reporting, combined with strong storytelling skills. Topics will run the gamut from government and education to health, the economy and elections.

The ideal candidate has an investigative mindset and is a generous teammate, joining a newsroom that is dedicated to producing great journalism, making public policy relatable and preserving reporters' work-life balance.

You'll join a team of experienced reporters and editors who will bend over backwards to help you produce the best work of your career. In addition to the support of RFA, we will support you with training, mentorships and generous budgets for travel and records requests.

Data-driven journalism is central to Bridge Michigan's mission. Our award-winning work on COVID-19, government spending and accountability has set a high bar, and we seek a talented journalist to expand this foundation into new platforms and audiences.

Bridge Michigan is one of America's great civic news organizations, with secure funding and a clear mission to improve Michigan through our reporting. We are committed to lifting diverse, often ignored voices and covering the state in an equitable manner — but we are also zealously nonpartisan and committed to questioning conventional wisdom in our reporting.

Position Requirements

- Professional journalism experience with data visualization and analysis tools preferred. We encourage applications from journalists at all experience levels
- A portfolio of work that demonstrates strong data journalism skills, including experience with programs such as Python, R, SQL or similar tools for data analysis and visualization
- Proficiency with data visualization tools (such as Flourish, Datawrapper, Tableau or similar platforms) and spreadsheet programs
- Strong writing and storytelling abilities, with the capacity to translate complex data into clear, compelling narratives for general audiences
- A creative mindset and deep curiosity about using data to uncover stories. Knowledge of Michigan is a plus, as is a willingness to travel throughout the state to report.
- A commitment to fairness, seeing all sides, a willingness to be surprised, and following facts
- A collaborative mindset and generous spirit. We want our reporters to be aggressive, but they need to be good co-workers, willing to assist colleagues with data analysis and visualization for their stories.
- A willingness to train and mentor fellow reporters in data journalism techniques and tools

Bridge Michigan has offices in Lansing and Detroit. This is not a remote job, and the successful applicant must be based in (or move to) Michigan. Otherwise, we are flexible and trust reporters to determine their best work environments.

Founded in 2006, the Center for Michigan is a nonprofit organization dedicated to making Michigan better through high-quality, nonpartisan journalism and engagement.

The Center for Michigan offers competitive salaries, eligibility for an end-of-year performance bonus and flexible work arrangements. The expected base salary range for this position is \$60,000 to \$74,000 annually, depending on experience; \$75,000 to \$92,000 annually with six or more years of experience. Our offices have a casual environment and we respect work-life balance. Benefits at the Center for Michigan include:
